

# FEMINIST ACTION BOARD



Hardy Girls Healthy Women (HGHW) takes girls and gender expansive youth seriously. We put the power in their hands to challenge a society that ignores their brilliance. We dare adult allies to join us.

#### Why the asterisk?

We use an asterisk to indicate that we welcome and celebrate the inclusivity of all girls and gender expansive youth. Gender is a social construct and for centuries it's held onto a binary (boys & girls) system. HGHW does not believe in the binary, but knows the deep history of systemic sexism and transphobia has uniquely harmed self-identifying girls and gender expansive folks. This is who we work with. As consistently learning intersectional feminists, we welcome and celebrate folks across all identities, abilities, races, ethnicities, religions, economic statuses and sexual orientations.

## Why did you change the name from G\*rls Advisory Board (GAB) to Feminist Action Board (FAB)?

The 2021-22 cohort of GAB voted in early 2022 to change the name to the Feminist Action Board (FAB) because (1) it better represents the gender diversity & inclusive values of Hardy Girls and FAB, and (2) it encompasses members' passion for feminism, social justice, and youth activism.

#### What is the Feminist Action Board (FAB)?

FAB is a group of Maine high schoolers (9th-12th grade) from around the state who are passionate about gender equity and social justice. Members plan and execute three regional G\*rls Rock! Conferences, do community outreach and education, maintain a social media presence, and work closely with the Board of Directors and staff to make sure that all HGHW programs remain relevant. There is no cost to participate in FAB.

#### Who makes up the FAB?

16-20 Maine high school girls and gender expansive youth from all around the state.

#### When & where does FAB meet?

We meet on the first Sunday of each month. We will meet in a hybrid model alternating between in-person and virtual meetings. The first in-person retreat is scheduled for the weekend of August 27 and 28. In-person meetings alternate between Waterville and Portland, and we organize carpools for every meeting. Outside of the meetings, FABbers spend about 5 hours a month on all things Hardy G\*rls Healthy Wom\*n, with the time commitment increasing around conferences in March and April.

Next steps will be announced in early July and the annual FAB kick-off retreat will be held on August 27-28 (ME location TBD)
